# Snow Day 2015







In Spanish class this week, the students have been learning all about the celebration of Carnival. We learned about the history of Carnival and the different ways it is celebrated throughout the world in places such as Rio de Janeiro, Barranquilla, and New Orleans. This month in P.E., our preschool students engaged in activities that focused on balance. Most have learned to balance on one foot for an extended period of time. They have also learned to balance objects on top of each other, such as balancing a ball. The elementary students have learned and engaged in hockey skills and games. The skills we practiced included dribbling and controlling a ball with the hockey stick, passing and trapping with partners, and shooting a hockey puck into the goal.

The students eventually learned to play a hockey game with realistic hockeystyle substitutions, involving strategy and teamwork. I am very pleased to see our students exercise stick safety, eliminating injury during game-play. Next month we will do circuit training exercises using the FITT principle, and learn to play volleyball!
